**Bob Dylan** is one of the best known representatives of the protest song movement which started in the sixties among young people in the United States and Great Britain. "Blowin' in the Wind" is Bob Dylan's first single of his second album *The Freewheelin' Bob Dylan*. In this song, Dylan poses a list of hypothetical questions; questions people may say cannot be answered, comparing them to the Civil Rights Struggle. An anthem for black people during the 60s, it even inspired Sam Cooke to write "A Change is Gonna Come". Dylan does not claim to know the answers, but beautifully says the answers are out there 'blowin' in the wind.'

# BOB DYLAN

▶ Bob Dylan was born Robert Allen Zimmerman in 1941. This American singer-songwriter first became famous during the 60s.

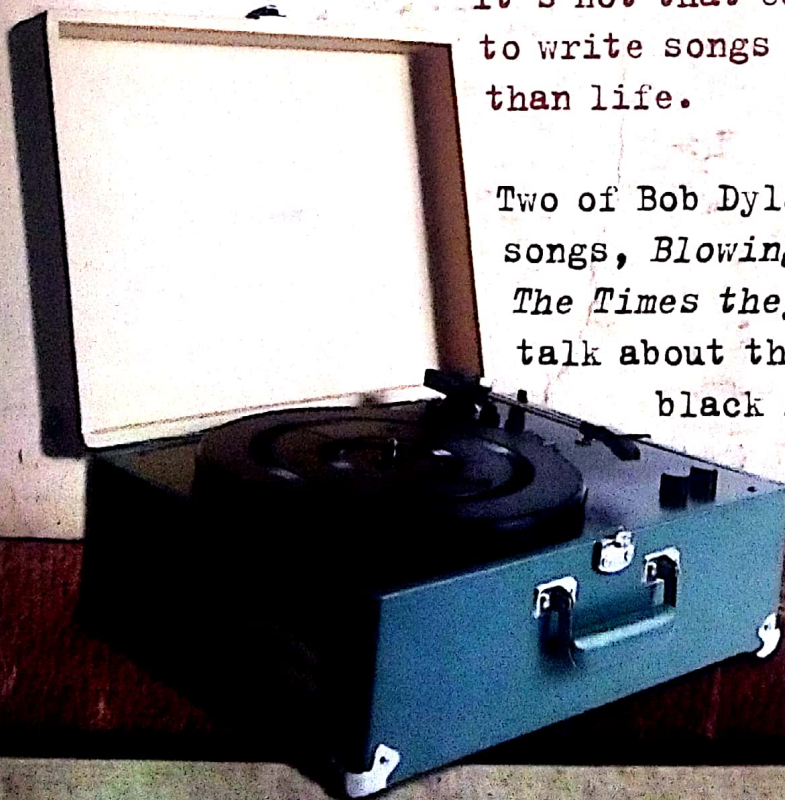
Bob Dylan published *Chronicles Volume 1*, in 2004. In this book he tells the story of his life. We read how he becomes a musician, and about the musicians he saw as his teachers.

## Chapter 2. Why I Write

I don't know when I had the idea to write my own songs. I think it happens slowly. You don't wake up one day and decide that you need to write songs.

It's not that easy. You want to write songs that are bigger than life.

Two of Bob Dylan's most famous songs, *Blowing in the Wind* and *The Times they are a-Changin'*, talk about the problems of being black in the US during segregation\*.



Segregation was a problem in American history (to 1964) when children could not go to "white" schools, etc.



In *Chronicles*, we learn how much Bob Dylan hated being famous. He didn't feel he was the "voice of a generation" that everyone called him. For Bob, it was important to remember that famous people are real people.

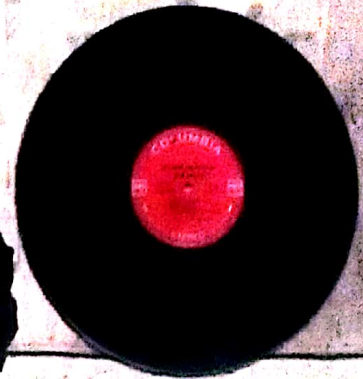
### Chapter 3. New Morning

I had a wife and children who I loved more than anything. I was just trying to make enough money, but the press\* kept saying I was the voice of a generation. That was funny. Being true to yourself was more important to me than all that.

*I'm Not There* (2007) is a film about Bob Dylan. Dylan is played by six different actors.

Bob Dylan has written music all his life, and he still gives concerts around the world. His music comes from the music traditions\* of America and Europe.
